LESSON PLAN

Giving Money

GRADES 5 to 6 TIME 45 minutes



OVERVIEW

Charitable giving is a personally fulfilling yet often neglected area of personal finance. This lesson explores different ways to give back and encourages students to budget for charitable giving. Students will design their own charity project and generate ideas about how they can contribute to the causes they care about.

GOALS

- · Encourage students to save money for giving
- Help students identify causes they are passionate about
- Provide students with a framework for designing their own charitable initiatives

OBJECTIVES

- Identify three ways to help others: donating money, donating goods and volunteering
- · List popular charitable causes
- Practice brainstorming actionable ways to support charitable causes locally

ASSESSMENT

An optional quiz has been provided with this lesson plan (the quiz is not factored into the lesson's 45-minute runtime).

Did you know? Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation for Childhood Cancer is a great example of an inspirational charity started by a kid.

Giving Money

TIMELINE

5 minutes Intro and show **VIDEO JR5**

(Giving Money)

10 minutes Go over PRESENTATION JR5

25 minutes Facilitate ACTIVITY

5 minutes Wrap up

(Optional) Assessment: QUIZ

(Giving Money)

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Introduce the topic: "When we think about managing our money, the first things that come to mind are spending and saving. We tend not to think about giving, even though giving money is an important part of personal finance."
- 2. Show VIDEO JR5
- 3. Go over PRESENTATION JR5
 - Pause at the "Three Money Jars" section (slide 12) and hand out

ARTICLE JR5 and **ACTIVITY SHEET JR5**

- · After the "Ask Yourself" section (slide 21), tell students that they will soon have the opportunity to design their own charity projects
- 4. Distribute the **ACTIVITY**
 - Divide students into small groups (or have students work individually)
 - · Display the list of charitable causes and have each group select a cause they would like to support
 - Distribute a charity project planner to each student
 - Allow time for groups to brainstorm and fill out their charity project planner
 - · Invite each group to present their project idea

- (Optional) If time permits, have students vote for the project they would like to carry out as a class
- 5. Wrap up by thanking the class for sharing their many project ideas and by reminding students that:
 - There are many ways to make a difference, including giving money
 - · Setting money aside for giving is a wonderful thing they can do for themselves and for their community
 - Using the three money jars concept is an easy way to start setting money aside for the important causes they care about
- 6. (Optional) Distribute QUIZ for individual assessment.
- 7. (Optional) Distribute copies of **COMIC JR5** for students to take home.
